Louie, Ai-Ling. Yeh-Shen : a Cinderella story from China. New York : Philomel Books, c1982. A young Chinese girl overcomes the wickedness of her stepsister and stepmother to become the bride of a prince.

Vieira, Linda. The ever-living tree : the life and times of a coast redwood. 1st paperback ed. New York : Walker, 1996. A chronological look at the life of a coast redwood, from the time it was planted until the current day. Includes information on the composition and make-up of the tree.

Tokuda, Yukihiisa, 1940-. I'm a pill bug. 1st American ed. La Jolla, CA : Kane/Miller Book Publishers, c2006. Simple text and illustrations describe the life cycle of pill bugs, where they live, what they eat, and how they protect themselves.

Markle, Sandra. Little lost bat. Watertown, MA : Charlesbridge, c2006. Chronicles the early life of an orphaned Mexican free-tailed bat, from its birth to its adoption by a new mother.

Ryder, Joanne. Earthdance. 1st ed. New York : H. Holt and Co., 1996. Readers are asked to picture themselves as the earth, turning in space, facing the light, feeling the green things growing and the oceans shifting.

Murphy, Jim, 1947-. The boys' war : Confederate and Union soldiers talk about the Civil War. New York : Clarion Books, c1990. Includes diary entries, personal letters, and archival photographs to describe the experiences of boys, sixteen years old or younger, who fought in the Civil War.

Addy, Sharon. Lucky Jake. Boston : Houghton Mifflin, 2007. While panning for gold with his Pa, Jake adopts a pig that he names Dog.

E BRA

Bradby, Marie. More than anything else. New York : Orchard Books, c1995. Nine-year-old Booker works with his father and brother at the saltworks but dreams of the day when he'll be able to read.

Bunting, Eve, 1928-. Fly away home. New York : Clarion Books,
